We, the May 2008 Grand Jury, heard 296 bill of indictments, returned 294 true bills and 2 no bills. This volume of bill of indictments was significantly less that the January 2008 Grand Jury volume of 342 and the September 2007 Grand Jury volume of 402 and was easily and effectively handled.

We, the May 2008 Grand Jury, would like to commend Superior Court Bailiff Jane Johnson for her assistance in arranging the material for the Grand Jury, managing the schedule of cases to be presented, coordinating the Grand Jury payroll, and helping the Grand Jury to run as smoothly as possible.
