**CHEROKEE COUNTY CLERK OF SUPERIOR COURT’S  
OFFICE TO OFFER SOCIALLY DISTANT SERVICES**

*Office will continue to be closed to the public until May 13*

**Canton, GA**—In accordance with Chief Justice Melton’s Order Extending Declaration of Statewide Judicial Emergency, the Cherokee County Clerk of Superior Court’s office will continue to fulfill its constitutional mandates and operate in a primarily virtual environment until May 13.

Clerk of Superior Court, Patty Baker, made the decision to offer socially distant services to protect her staff and to be responsible to the greater Cherokee community, and wishes to continue to make efforts to flatten the curve of COVID-19. Non-emergency services, including passport applications, notary commissions, and trade names will not be available until May 13.

Customers can electronically file criminal and civil documents at [www.efileGA.com](http://www.efileGA.com). Criminal documents and other documents not required to be e-filed are still accepted by mail and we have made accommodations to accept documents safely at our office. Portals to electronically file real estate documents may be found at [www.clerk.cherokeega.com/deeds-and-records-department/e-filing/](http://www.clerk.cherokeega.com/deeds-and-records-department/e-filing/), and traffic citation payments may be made online at [www.cherokeecotix.com](http://www.cherokeecotix.com) or by mail. We have also set up a kiosk located in the Jury Assembly Room through which we can remotely assist self-represented litigants e-file their documents.

We will make special accommodations for filings of temporary protective orders and other emergency filings. If you are a victim of domestic violence or your health and safety is at risk and need assistance, please call 911 or contact the Family Violence Center at 770-479-1703 or 1-800-33-HAVEN. If you do not wish to contact Family Violence and need help with filing your documents, please contact our office via email or at 678-493-6511 to set up an appointment. If you do not have telephone or internet access, reasonable accommodations will be made to safely assist you.

The Clerk’s office has invested time and money on technology which allows this socially distant service and continues to work with the county to facilitate enhanced remote access.
