What is the Comprehensive Transportation Plan Update?

Every five years, Cherokee County takes a close look at the transportation needs of people who live, work, and play throughout the County. This effort, funded by the Atlanta Regional Commission, will examine the many changes that have occurred in the County's population, employment, land use and development since the adoption of the 2008 Cherokee County Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP).

With these changes in mind, the County will work with the public to reevaluate the vision, goals, objectives, and investment strategies set forth in the 2008 plan. Existing and future needs will be updated, and potential solutions, with a focus on innovative, less costly options, will be identified. The updated CTP will include a funding strategy and a prioritized list of future SPLOST projects.

With the help of the public throughout the planning process, the CTP update will reflect the County's current transportation needs while addressing future growth opportunities.
